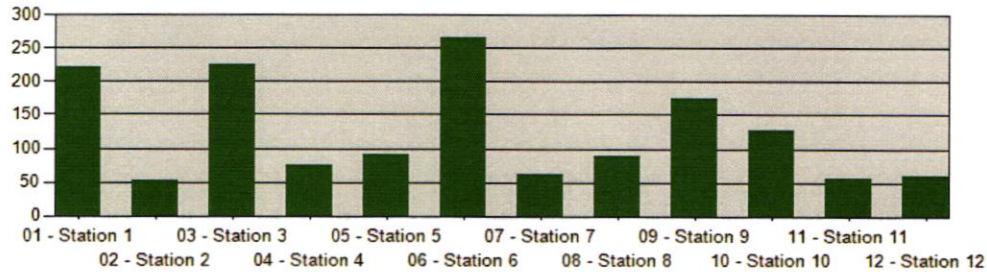

Incidents Per Station For Date and Time Range with End Time Next Day for Station

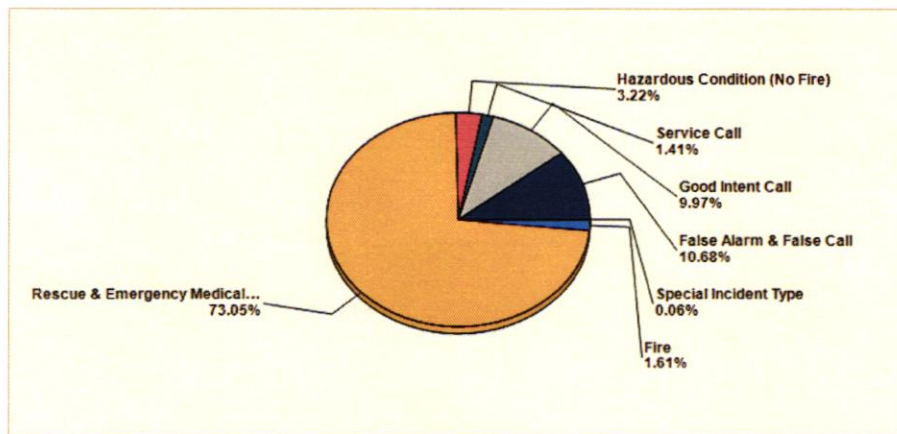
