PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

June 17, 2020 – 4:00 P.M.
via Google Meets

CALL TO ORDER:

A meeting of the City of Clarksville Public Safety Committee was called to order by Chairman Jeff Henley on Wednesday, June 17, 2020 at 4:00 p.m. This meeting was conducted via Google Meets.

ATTENDANCE:

The following members responded to roll call and were connected to the meeting:

Councilman Jeff Henley, Chair; Councilman Ron Erb; Councilman Vondell Richmond;
Councilman Travis Holleman; Councilwoman Wanda Smith

Others Participating: Mayor Joe Pitts, Building Official/Deputy Director Justin Crosby, Deputy Chief David Crockarell, Deputy Chief Rick Stalder, Fire Chief Freddie Montgomery, Councilwoman Stacey Streetman, Neil Stauffer, City Attorney and Paula McWhirter

APPROVAL OF ELECTRONIC MEETING:

In order to comply with the technical aspects of the Governor's Executive Order regarding holding open meetings in a forum other than in the open and in public, the Public Safety Committee determines that meeting electronically is necessary to protect the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens due to the COVID-19 outbreak.

Councilwoman Smith made a motion to approve the electronic meeting. The motion was seconded by Councilman Holleman. The vote for the motion to conduct this meeting by electronic means was approved unanimously by the Committee.

Minutes from the February 19, 2020 meeting were approved by the committee after a motion was made by Councilwoman Smith, seconded by Councilman Holleman. The vote for motion was unanimous.

BUILDING & CODES DEPARTMENT:

- Justin Crosby presented the department's monthly report and gave a brief overview of the department's stats and stated he would answer any questions.
- Mayor Pitts asked Mr. Crosby to give an update on the Multi Purpose Event Center. Mr. Crosby gave a brief update stating the County has started the planning and permitting process for the Multi Purpose Event Center and he, Mr. Smith and the Building & Codes

staff have been working directly with the general contractor and county staff to ensure open communication and provide construction guidelines and information to ensure a smooth permitting process. Councilwoman Smith asked where the event center will be located and what the square footage of the building will be. Mr. Crosby advised the location is between 1st and 2nd Street and because they are still in the design stage, the square footage has not been finalized.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

- Deputy Chief Crockarell presented the department's monthly report and advised he would answer any questions. Deputy Chief Crockarell informed the Committee the department's lobbies are now open to the public. The department is in a time of transition with Chief Ansley on annual leave as of June 12, 2020 with his official retirement being June 30, 2020.
- Deputy Chief Crockarell updated the Committee on the demonstration that took place May 30th on Wilma Rudolph Blvd. stating the demonstration was positive and the department is being invited to similar demonstrations in an endeavor to demonstrate an open dialogue. He also stated in an effort to build up a community connection it is important to understand and listen and create conversations. Councilwoman Smith expressed concerns and asked how does the department address the type of situation as in the case of George Floyd? Deputy Chief Crockarell advised under no circumstance should an officer kneel on someone's neck and actually once a person is handcuffed the officer is responsible to ensure his/her safety. Deputy Chief Crockarell further stated an officer has a responsibility to aid an arrested individual who is in distress and anything less than that other officers have a duty to intervene. Councilman Richmond asked Deputy Chief Crockarell and Mayor Pitts if they would be open to having a workshop/training in an effort to better educate and inform the City Council members and constituents on these type of issues; both the Mayor and Deputy Chief Crockarell stated they were very open to having open dialogue virtually and/or in small groups.
- Deputy Chief Crockarell stated the department needs to mirror the community in which they serve and advised the Committee a top priority for CPD is diversity in the workplace. In a continued effort to become more diverse he stated the department has gone to traditional job fairs, expanding exposure through social media, working closely with Ft. Campbell as well as maintaining contact with the Police Academy. He further stated they have a long way to go but he is committed to building a much more diverse department.
- Deputy Chief Crockarell informed the Committee the ground breaking for District 3 Precinct is scheduled for June 26, 2020.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

- Chief Montgomery presented the department's monthly report and gave a brief breakdown by Division and stated he would answer any questions.
- Chief Montgomery stated COVID-19 has presented interesting times; however, the department is presently at 100%. Run numbers are starting to rebound, with rescue related calls being 72% and approximately \$210,000 in fire related loss.
- Blue Way training is complete and Clarksville Fire Rescue is properly trained and equipped to provide rescues on the blueway.

- Chief Montgomery advised Fire Prevention has performed 76 inspections and 37 commercial burn permits have been issued (the designated phone number for information regarding "open burning" is working well).
- The Training Division hosted 2 state testing events (online) with 510 attendees and conducted over 1700 training hours. Chief Montgomery informed the Committee of an upcoming hiring process that is set to focus on diversity and test a pool of approximately 600 candidates.
- Councilwoman Smith thanked Chief Montgomery for his report and regarding new hires asked how many African Americans applied. Chief Montgomery advised out of the 60 applicants that took the written exam 1 was African American. Chief again reiterated the department is looking for diverse applicants and with that being said advised the department has scheduled two open practice events to allow applicants to get familiar with the requirements of the physical agility test. The events are scheduled for July 11 and July 18 at the Fire Station 1. Chairman Henley asked Chief Montgomery if he has tried to recruit from Ft. Campbell. Chief confirmed that is definitely on his radar and stated the department is presently working with the Fire Science Program at Rossvie High School. Chairman Henley along with Councilwoman Smith stated there may be a need to look into changing the age from 21 to 18.

CITY COUNCIL ACTION REQUIRED

- Deputy Chief Crockarell explained Resolution 1-2020-21 authorizing an Interlocal Agreement between the City of Clarksville, Tennessee and the E911 Emergency Communication District of Montgomery County, Tennessee. After general discussion motion for approval was made by Councilwoman Smith, seconded by Councilman Richmond. The vote for the motion was unanimous.
- Deputy Chief Crockarell explained Resolution 2-2020-21 authorizing an Interlocal Agreement between the City of Clarksville and Montgomery County related to shared expenses for autopsies. After general discussion motion for approval was made by Councilwoman Smith, seconded by Councilman Holleman. The vote for the motion was unanimous.
- Chairman Henley recognized Councilwoman Streetman to present Ordinance 1-2020-21: An Ordinance amending Title 5 of the Official City Code to add a new chapter entitled "Short-Term Rentals" to establish regulations pertaining to short-term rental units. Councilwoman Streetman gave a detailed overview of the Ordinance to include the application requirements and procedures such as permitting, inspections/re-inspections, insurance and other issues relating to protecting the health, safety and welfare of the public. After general discussion Councilwoman Smith stated because this is so much information presented at one time she would like to postpone any action until the Committee has more time to review what is being proposed and with that being said Councilwoman Smith made a motion to postpone action until a later date and the motion was seconded by Councilman Richmond. The vote for the motion was three (3) in favor and two (2) against (Councilman Henley and Councilman Erb). Following the vote Councilwoman Streetman advised the Committee she is going forward with presenting this Ordinance and it will be on the June 23, 2020 Finance Committee agenda.

OTHER

Deputy Chief Crockarell gave an overview of the department's policies and procedures specifically relating to arrests, use of force and the prevention of police bias/racial profiling. In 2007 the department began the process to obtain a national accreditation through the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA) with the department receiving its initial accreditation in 2010 and scheduled to receive its fourth CALEA certification this year. Deputy Chief Crockarell stated the department is strong and well prepared because of its commitment to the accreditation requirements; commitment to accountability as well as realizing and understanding the importance of communication, education and training.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further discussion motion to adjourn was made by Councilwoman Smith, seconded by Councilman Richmond and approved by the committee.

RESOLUTION 11-2020-21

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH
MONTGOMERY COUNTY EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated Section 12-9-108 authorizes the City of Clarksville and the Montgomery County Emergency Medical Services to contract with the other to perform any governmental service, activity or undertaking which each is authorized by law to perform, provided that such contract is authorized by the governing body of each party to the contract; and

WHEREAS, the City of Clarksville (Clarksville Fire Rescue and Clarksville Police Department) finds it necessary to establish permission and guidelines for the use of City of Clarksville radio talk-groups and channels by Montgomery County Emergency Medical Services; and

WHEREAS, this Interlocal Agreement imposes certain protocols, procedures, and obligations upon Montgomery County EMS hereby authorized to use licensed radio talk-groups and channels held by the City of Clarksville.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLARKSVILLE, TENNESSEE:

That the Clarksville City Council hereby authorizes an Interlocal Agreement, attached hereto as Exhibit A, between the City of Clarksville (Clarksville Fire Rescue and Clarksville Police Department) and Montgomery County Emergency Medical Services for use of City of Clarksville licensed frequencies for the purpose of having shared talk-groups and channels for emergency responses.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

Montgomery County Emergency Medical Services

Montgomery County EMS
And
Clarksville Fire Rescue / Clarksville Police Department

Purpose:

This Interlocal Agreement establishes permission and guidelines for the use of the Clarksville Fire Rescue (CFR), Clarksville Police Department (CPD) radio talk-groups and channels by Montgomery County EMS (MCEMS).

It imposes certain protocols, procedures, and obligations upon Montgomery County EMS hereby authorized to use licensed radio talk-groups and channels held by the City of Clarksville Tennessee

This agreement supersedes any Interlocal Agreement or letter of authorization previously issued.

Authority:

This Interlocal Agreement authorizes the use of City of Clarksville Tennessee; licensed frequencies for the purpose of Montgomery County EMS having the shared talk-groups and channels with coordination between emergency response agencies and resources. Such coordination may occur during interagency operations or on scene incident communications.

Understanding:

CFR and CPD will: Manage and maintain proper licenses for the use of frequencies identified by CFR and CPD. Restrict access to the conventional repeater systems; allow access to layer of the fail soft trunk system. Manage and maintain the operation and maintenance of said radio system and be responsible for programing all radios on the radio system.

Montgomery County EMS will: Use assigned radio talk-groups and channels authorized by CFR and CPD to coordinate response agencies and resources. Such coordination may occur during interagency operations or on-scene incidents. Montgomery County EMS will be allowed to have the following talk-groups and channels.

Clarksville Police Department (CPD): District 1, District 2, District 3

Clarksville Fire Rescue (CFR): Fire Dispatch

CPD & CFR joint talk-groups: Event 1, Event 2, Event 3, P-Safety 1, P-Safety 2, P-Safety 3

Montgomery County EMS will be responsible for all cost and repairs of radio equipment to be used by the EMS department. Clarksville Fire Rescue will assist in firmware updates and programming.

The parties mutually agree:

Montgomery Count EMS, CFR and CPD agree that their mutual interests with be furthered by continued coordination between Montgomery County EMS and the CFR and CPD. Montgomery County EMS, Clarksville Fire Rescue and the Clarksville Police Department agree that this Interlocal Agreement may be cancelled at any time, by written notice to the other party or by subsequent agreements.

Should Montgomery County EMS elect to withdraw from this Interlocal Agreement, notice shall be given by mail to the City of Clarksville Tennessee, Fire Rescue and Police Department.

RESOLUTION 10-2020-21

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH MONTGOMERY COUNTY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated Section 12-9-108 authorizes the City of Clarksville and the Montgomery County Emergency Management Agency to contract with the other to perform any governmental service, activity or undertaking which each is authorized by law to perform, provided that such contract is authorized by the governing body of each party to the contract; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLARKSVILLE, TENNESSEE:

That the Clarksville City Council hereby authorizes an Interlocal Agreement, attached hereto as Exhibit A, between the City of Clarksville (Clarksville Fire Rescue and Clarksville Police Department) and Montgomery County Emergency Management Agency for use of City of Clarksville licensed frequencies for the purpose of having shared talk-groups and channels for emergency responses.

Purpose:

This Interlocal Agreement establishes permission and guidelines for the use of the Clarksville Fire Rescue (CFR), Clarksville Police Department (CPD) radio talk-groups and channels by Montgomery County EMA (MCEMA).

It imposes certain protocols, procedures, and obligations upon Montgomery County EMA hereby authorized to use licensed radio talk-groups and channels held by the City of Clarksville Tennessee

Authority:

This Interlocal Agreement authorizes the use of City of Clarksville Tennessee; licensed frequencies for the purpose of Montgomery County EMA having the shared talk-groups and channels with coordination between emergency response agencies and resources. Understanding:

CFR and CPD will: Manage and maintain proper licenses for the use of frequencies identified by CFR and CPD. Restrict access to the conventional repeater systems; allow access to the fail soft trunk system. Manage and maintain the operation and maintenance of said radio system and be responsible for programming all radios on the radio system.

Montgomery County EMA will: Use assigned radio talk-groups and channels authorized by CFR and CPD to coordinate response agencies and resources. Such coordination may occur during interagency operations or on-scene incidents. Montgomery County EMA will be allowed to have the following talk-groups and channels.

Clarksville Police Department (CPD): District 1, District 2, District 3

Clarksville Fire Rescue (CFR): Fire Dispatch

CPD & CFR joint talk-groups: Event 1, Event 2, Event 3, P-Safety 1, P-Safety 2, P-Safety 3

Montgomery County EMA will be responsible for all cost and repairs of radio equipment to be used by the EMA. Clarksville Fire Rescue will assist in firmware updates and programming.

The parties mutually agree:

Montgomery County EMA, CFR and CPD agree that their mutual interests will be furthered by continued coordination between Montgomery County EMA CFR and CPD. Montgomery County EMA, Clarksville Fire Rescue and the Clarksville Police Department agree that this Interlocal Agreement may be cancelled at any time, by written notice to the other party or by subsequent agreements.

Should Montgomery County EMA elect to withdraw from this Interlocal Agreement, notice shall be given by mail to the City of Clarksville Tennessee, Fire rescue and Police Department.
