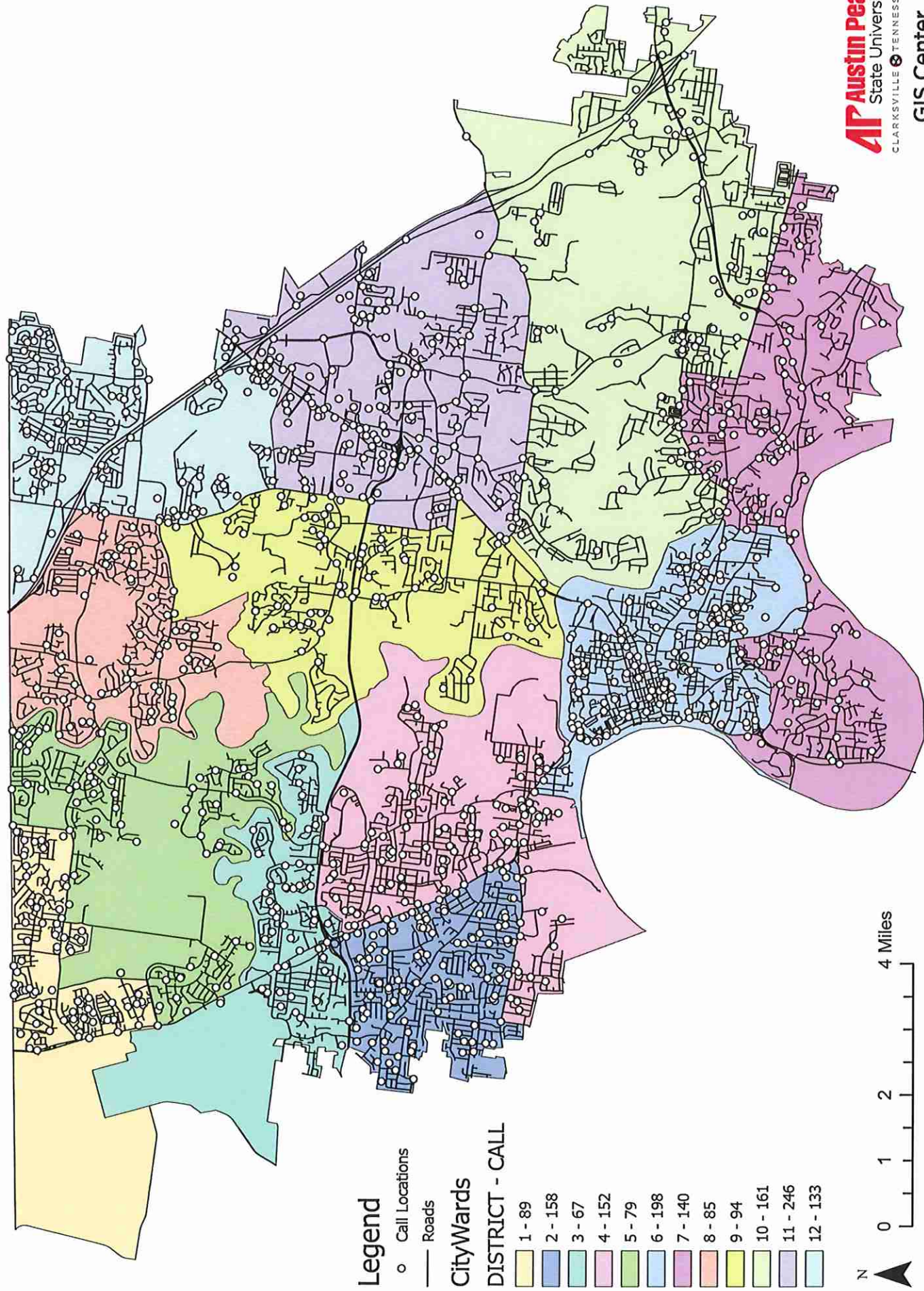

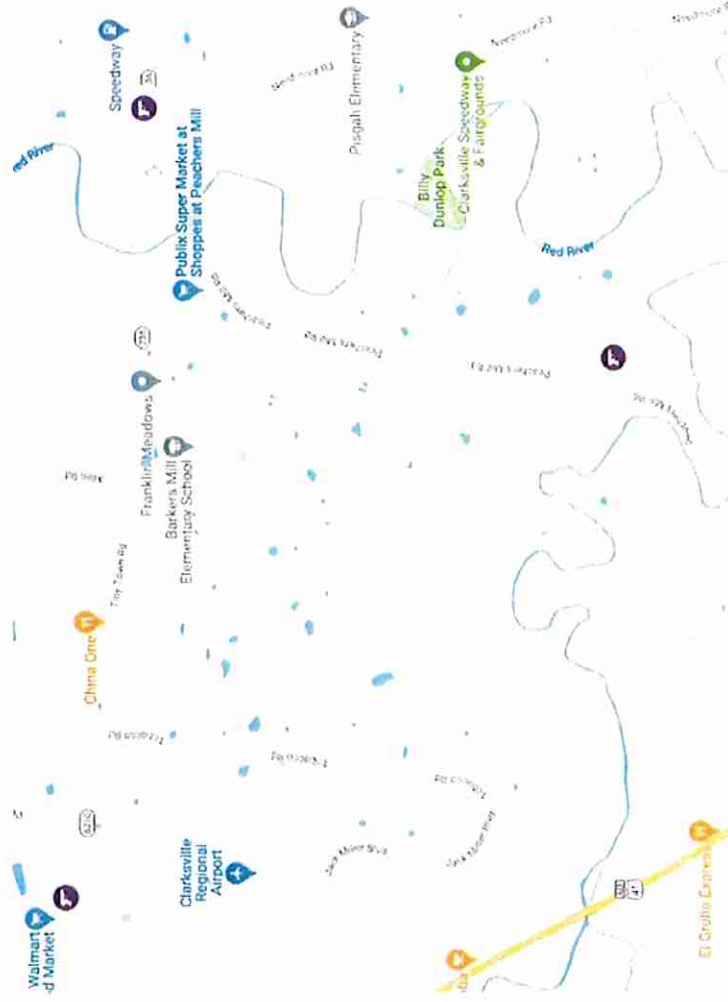

Vehicle Burglary - Weapons Stolen (January 10 – 23, 2024)

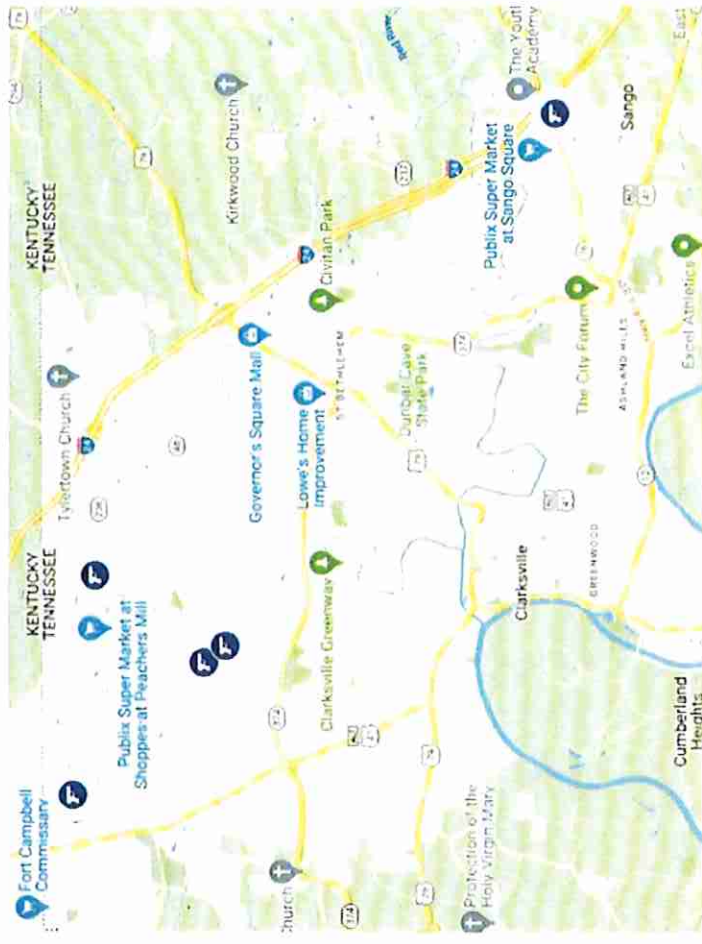
- 3 incidents reported with weapons stolen

- A Ruger LCP, Sccy CPX, Glock 19, and Palmetto Armory KS47 were all stolen.



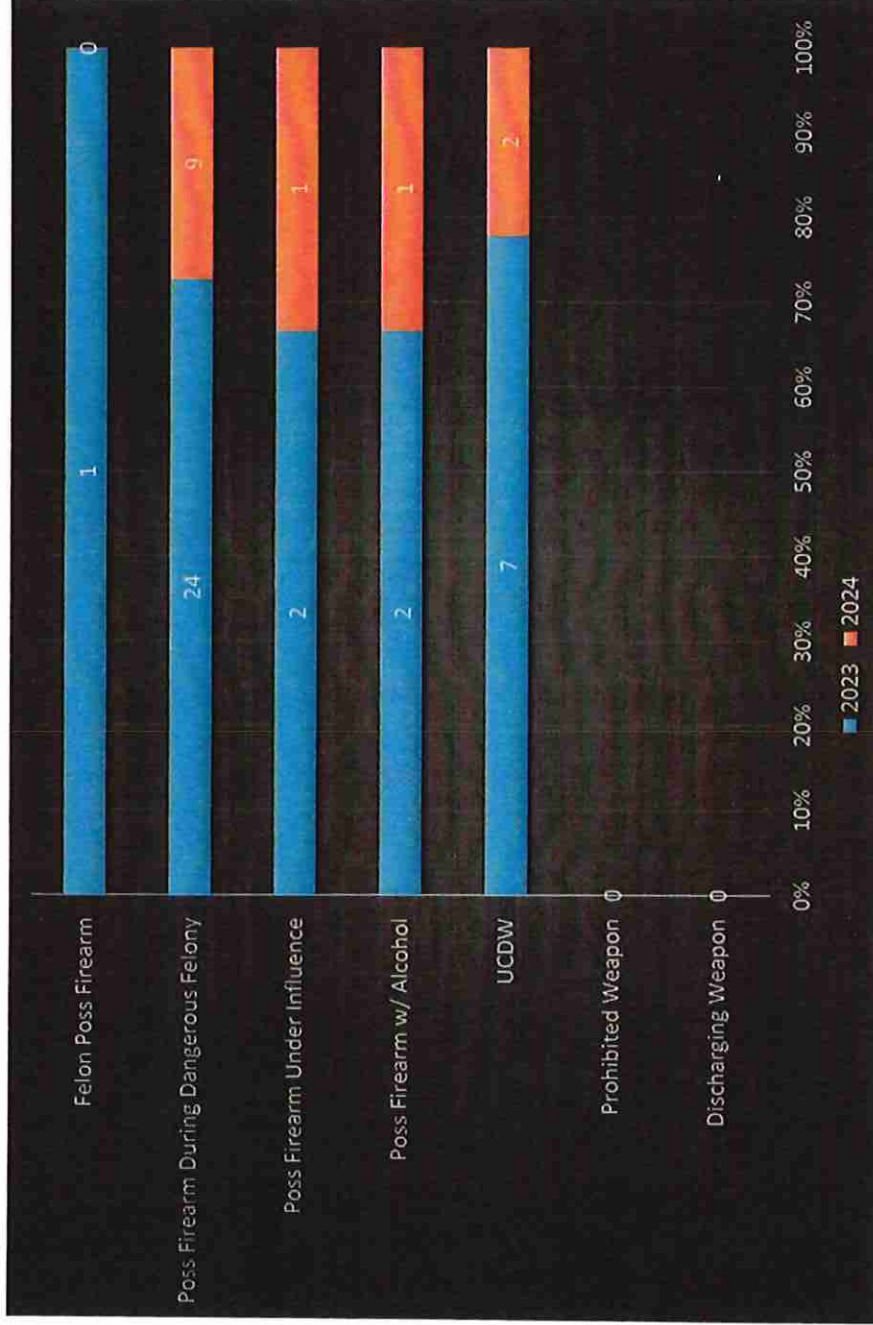
Vehicle Burglary - Weapons Stolen

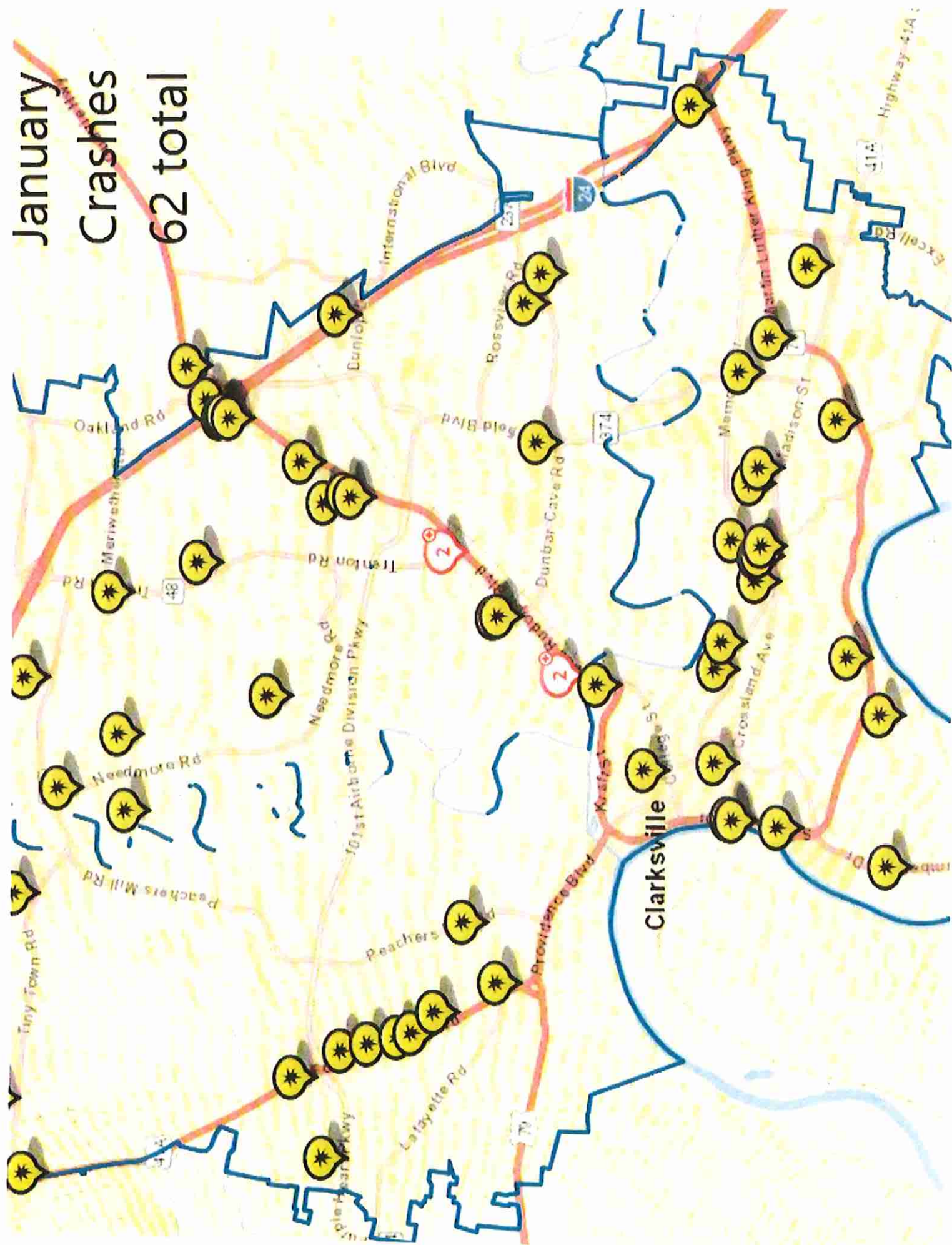

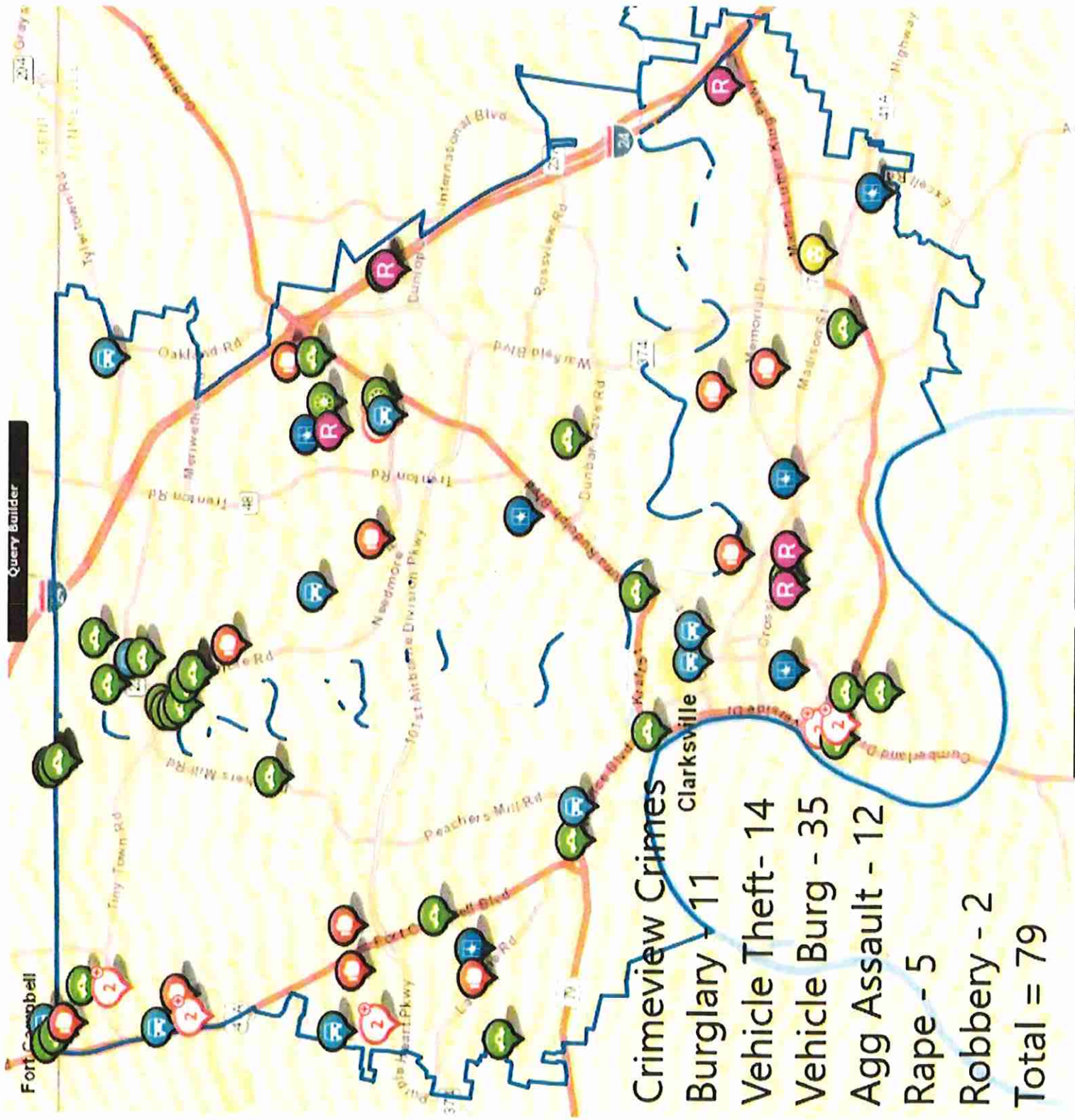
