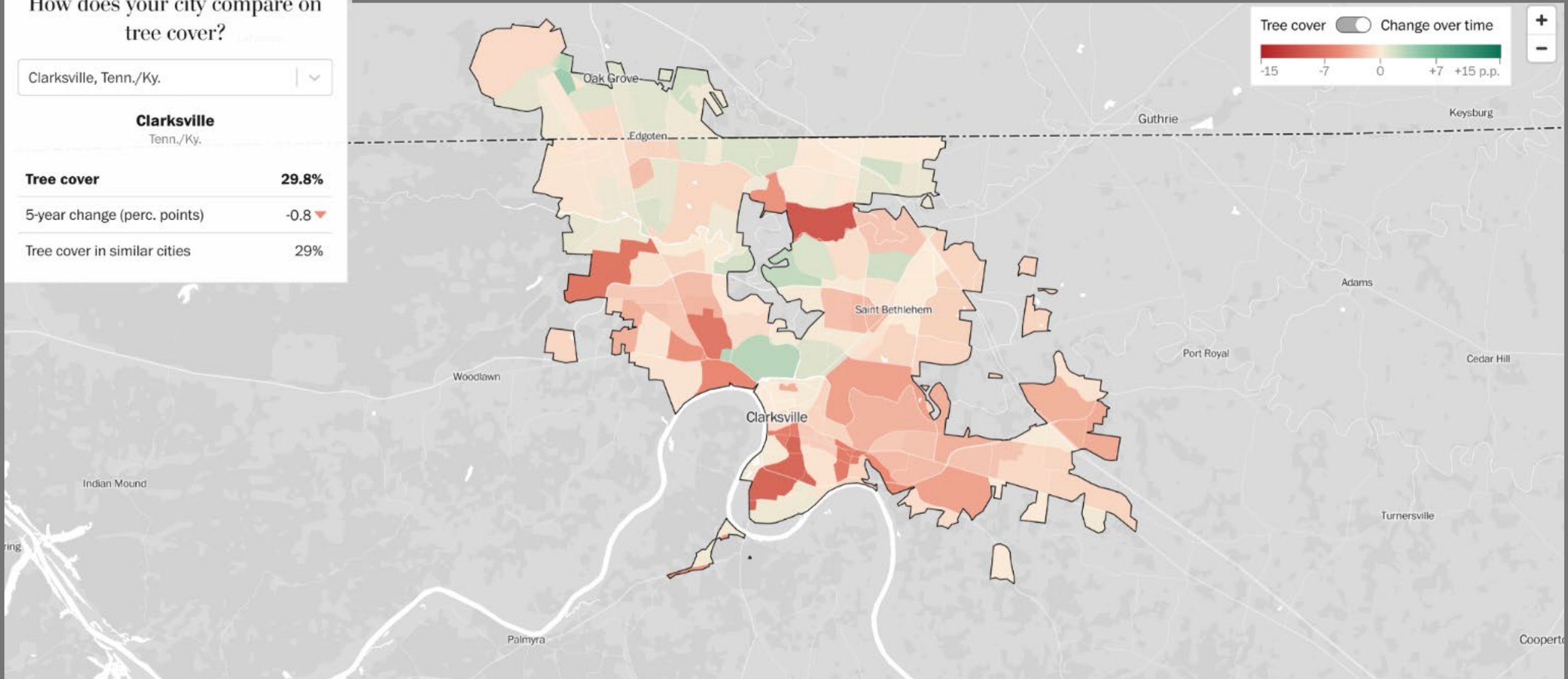
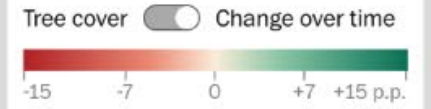

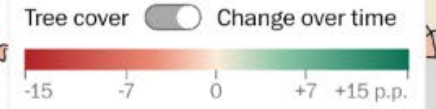

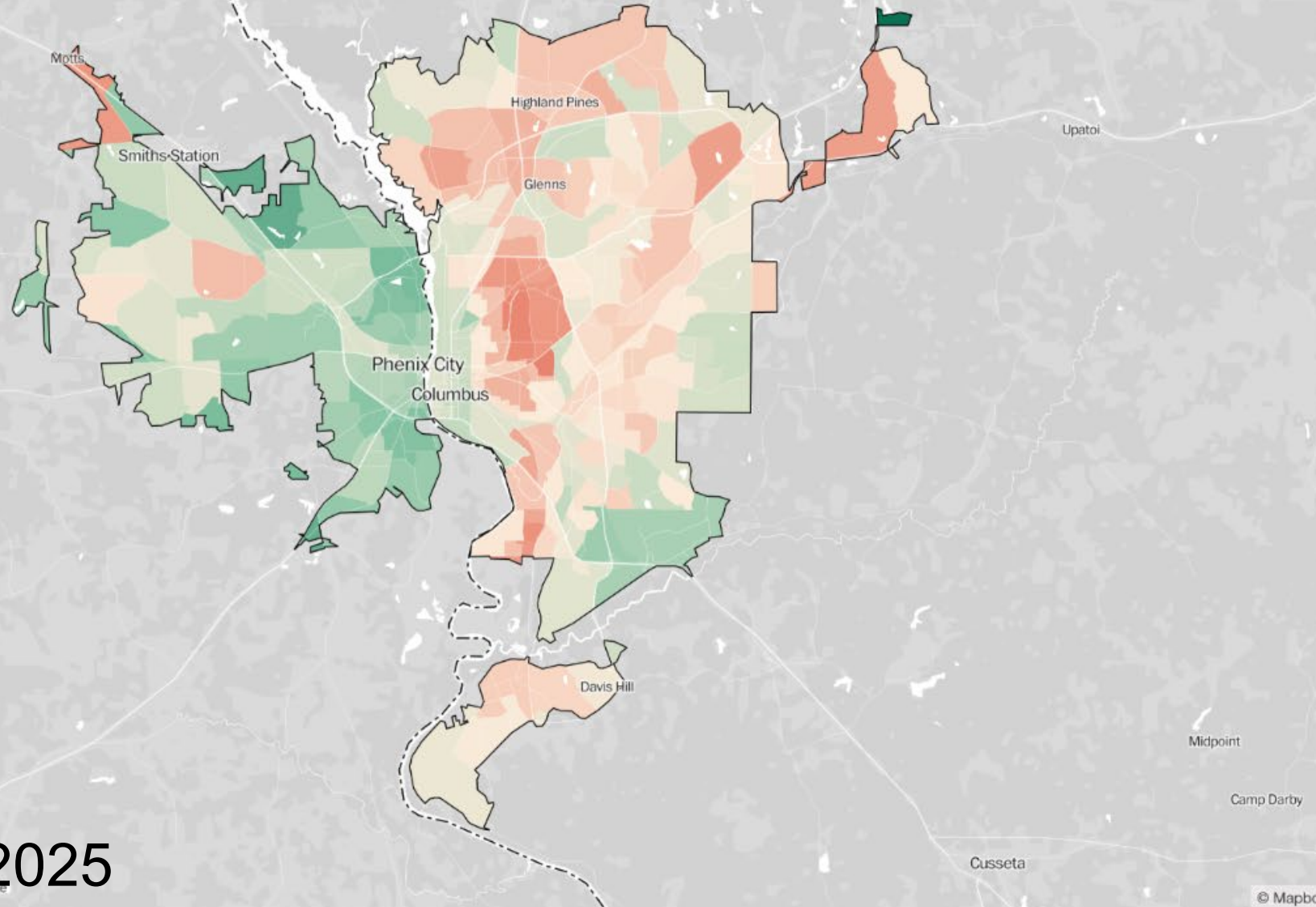

Original:

Sec. 1-1713. - Tree board composition; terms of office; filling vacancy.

The tree board shall be composed of seven (7) members appointed by the mayor and approved by the city council, with the terms of the members to be for three (3) years. Term appointments shall be made on a staggered three-year rotating basis, with three (3) members appointed in one (1) year, two (2) members appointed the next year, and two (2) members appointed the following year. Members may be reappointed by the mayor, and approved by the city council, to a second consecutive three-year term. The city forester shall serve as an ex officio member of the board. If a vacancy should occur within the term of any member, a successor shall be recommended by the mayor and approved by the city council for the duration of the unexpired term of that member.(Ord. No. 32-2009-10, 10-9-09)

Revised:

Sec. 1-1713. – Tree Board: Composition, Terms, Vacancies, Qualifications, and Removal

(a) Composition and Appointment

The Tree Board shall consist of seven (7) voting members, each appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by a majority vote of the City Council. The City Forester shall serve as a non-voting ex officio member. Appointments shall be made in accordance with applicable provisions of the Tennessee Code Annotated and local ordinances.

(b) Officers and Duties

At the first meeting of each calendar year, the Board shall elect from among its voting members a Chair, Vice-Chair, and Secretary. Officers shall serve one (1) year terms and may be re-elected.

Chair:

The Chair shall preside at all meetings, ensure compliance with adopted procedures and the Tennessee Open Meetings Act (T.C.A. § 8-44-101 et seq.), serve as the primary spokesperson, set meeting agendas in consultation with other officers, appoint committees as needed, and perform other duties as assigned by the Board.

Vice-Chair:

The Vice-Chair shall act in the absence or incapacity of the Chair and assist as needed.

Secretary:

The Secretary shall maintain accurate minutes and records of all meetings, ensure proper notice of meetings in compliance with state law, and maintain all official Board documents.

(c) Qualifications

A minimum of four (4) members shall possess demonstrated knowledge or interest in arboriculture, horticulture, forestry, landscape architecture, environmental science, or related fields. All members must be residents of the city or the county in which the city is located at the time of appointment and throughout their term. Members shall comply with all applicable conflict of interest and ethics provisions as set forth in state law and city ordinances.

(d) Terms of Office

Members shall serve staggered three (3) year terms. Initial appointments shall be made so that three (3) members serve for three years, two (2) members serve for two years, and two (2) members serve for one year. Thereafter, all appointments shall be for three years. No member may serve more than two (2) consecutive full terms.

(e) Filling Vacancies

Vacancies occurring prior to the expiration of a term shall be filled by appointment of the Mayor for the remainder of the unexpired term. New appointments shall be made within three (3) months of prior member terms ending.

(f) Removal and Attendance

Any member may be removed for cause by the Mayor, with the approval of the City Council. Cause for removal includes, but is not limited to:

1. Failure to attend three (3) consecutive regular meetings without prior notice;
2. Violation of conflict of interest or ethics provisions;
3. Conduct detrimental to the Board's purpose or to the public interest.

Members shall be provided written notice of proposed removal and an opportunity to respond prior to final action.
