4. Department Reports

A. [Building & Code Department Reports](#)

Building & Codes Department Reports -
Justin Crosby, Director of Building and Codes, presented the department's monthly report. In February, the Construction Division completed 3,388 inspections, while Code Enforcement opened 504 new cases. The Abatement Division carried out 31 work orders, and the

department's total revenue for the month was \$534,697.24

B. [Clarksville Police Department Reports](#)

Deputy Chief Scott Thornton of the Police Department reviewed the monthly report on behalf of the Clarksville Police Department. He stated they had over 14,594 calls for service in the month of May. They are currently slotted for 358 persons at a level of 346 people. Two will graduate from Tn. Law Enforcement Training Academy on Friday. They hired three people yesterday and two are pre-certified and were previously in the department. They will go on the road in roughly a month. Upcoming large events will be the Miss Tn and Miss Georgia Pageant at APSU next weekend. They will have over 50 off-duty officers and on duty officers at the July 3rd City Event. A Promotion/Retirement and Ceremony next Tuesday 24th at the Wilma Rudolph Event Center.

C. [Clarksville Fire Rescue Reports](#)

Freddie Montgomery, Chief of Clarksville Fire Rescue, presented the monthly report for the fire department. The department responded to 1,710 calls; 69% of the calls were Medical Related Calls. 14 Structure fires, 1.1 million in damage with 69,644,950 million Pre-incident values.

They have had 22 Community Events. Fire Maintenance Division 412 work orders. Fire Prevention 422 Inspections. Training Division 108 Classes 264 students. They will be interviewing candidates for the next two weeks to fill the 14 vacancies. The Academy will start July 28th and will now be 6 months of training.

Chief Montgomery discusses how the Fire Department staffing works from beginning to the end of the process. The Department is not outside its normal priorities.

D. [Municipal Court Reports](#)

Ernie Griffith, City Court, presented the City Courts monthly report. For the month of February, they had a total of 1,827 citations and 1,998 violations. The court has collected a total revenue of \$149,543.83

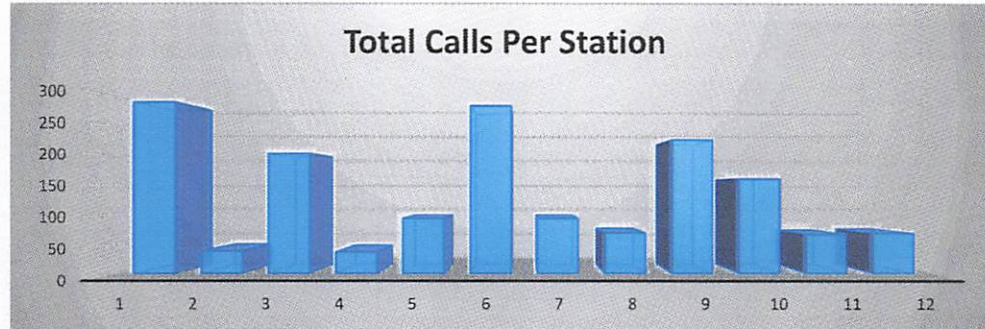

Incidents Per Station For Date and Time Range with End Time Next Day for Station

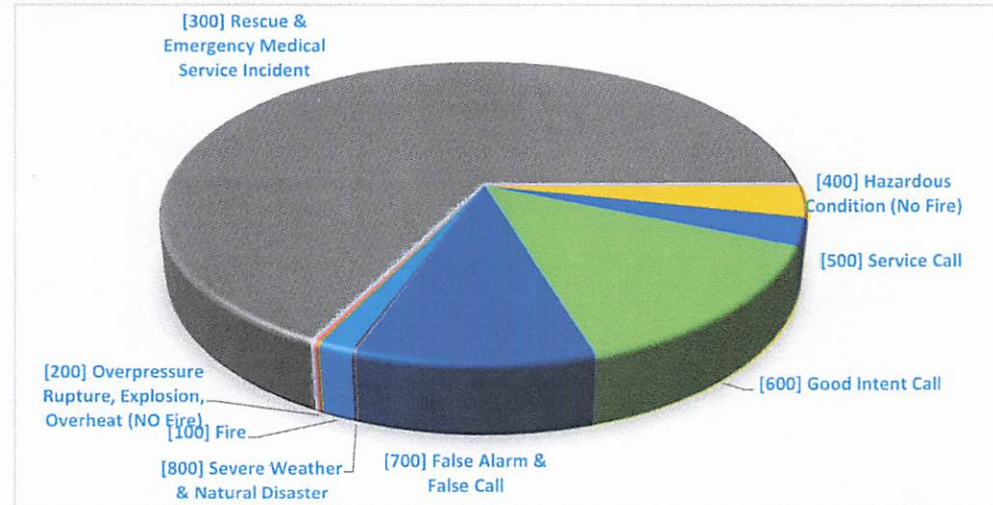

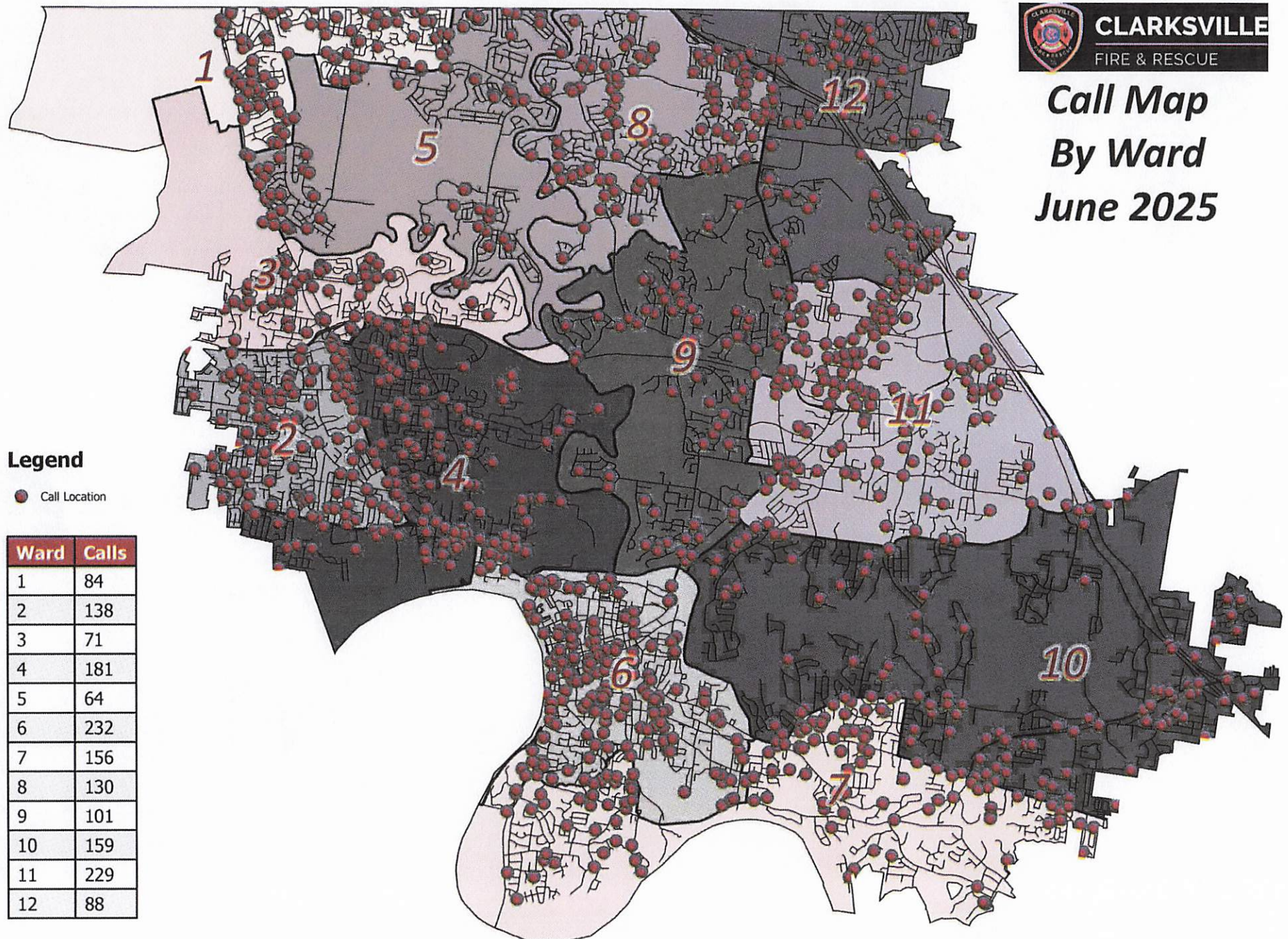

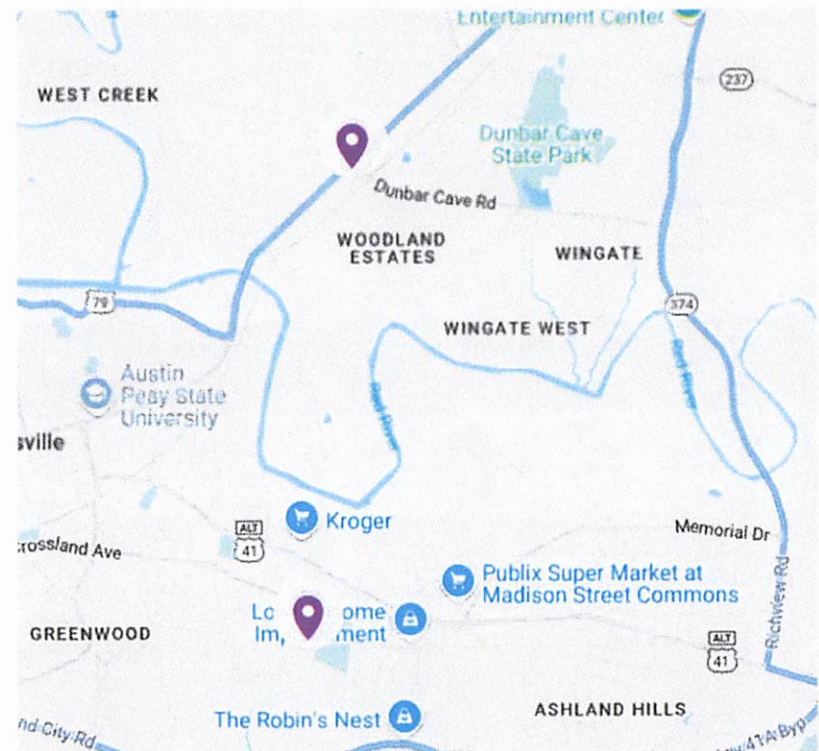

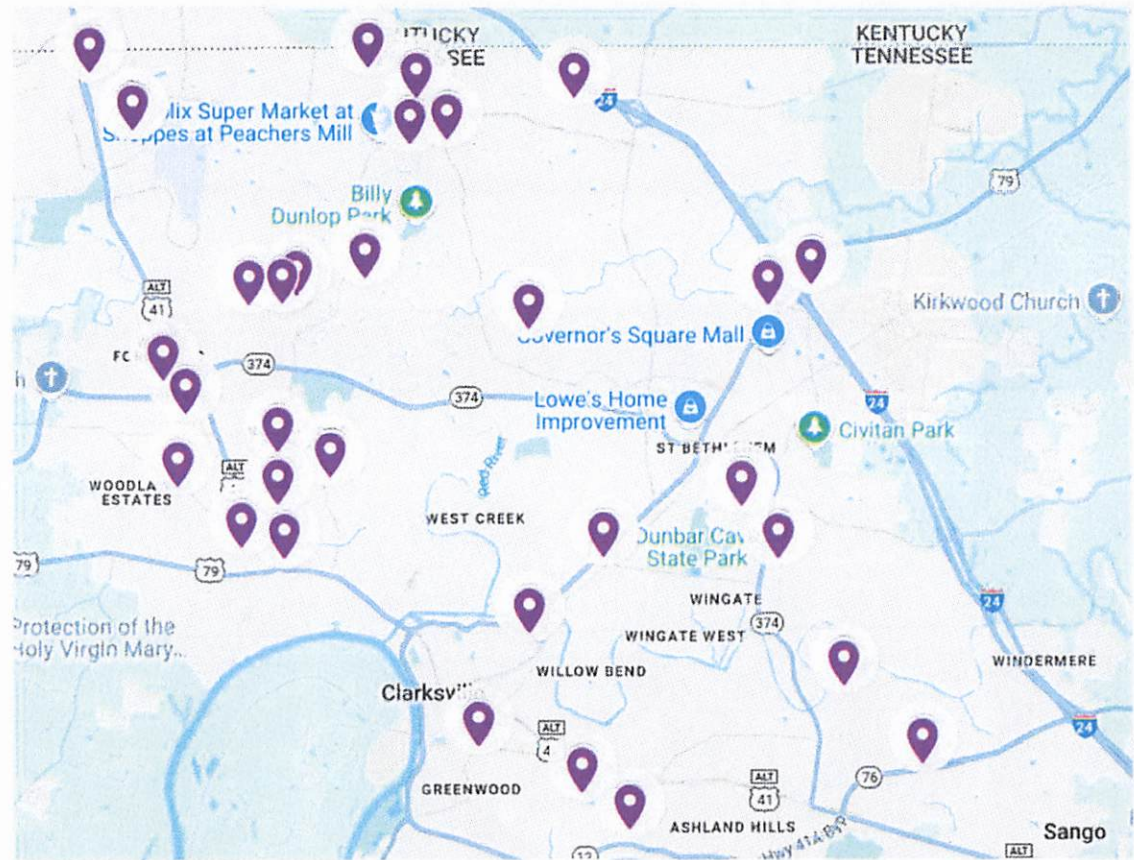

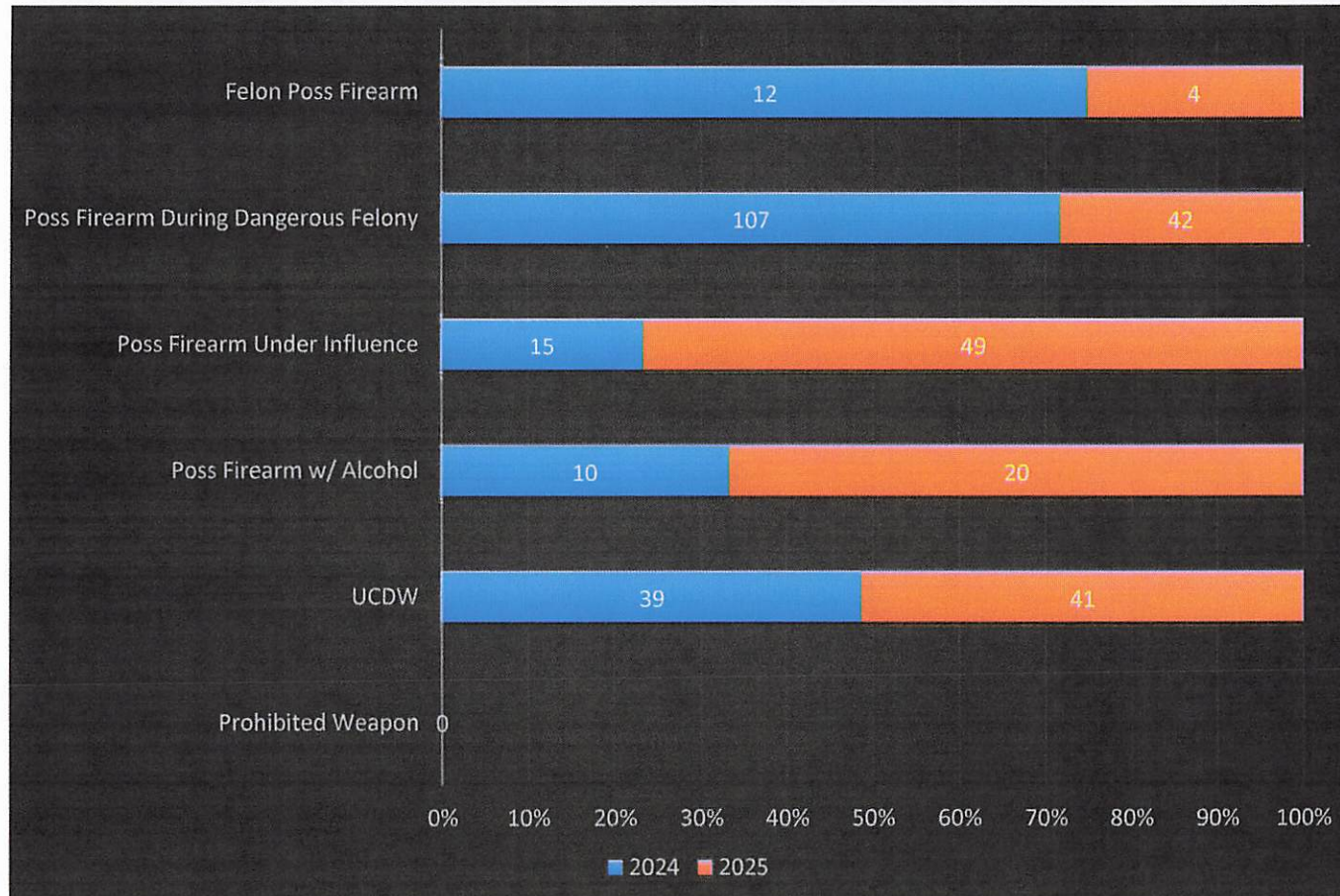

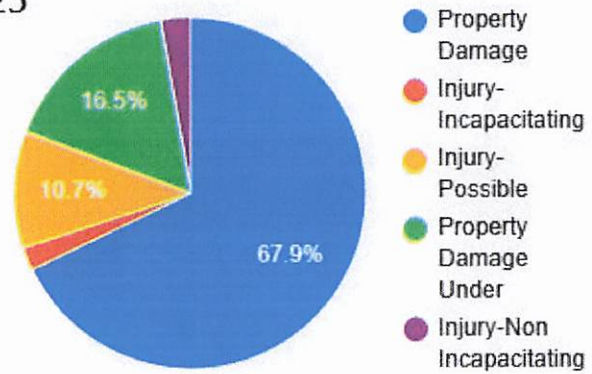

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AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CLARKSVILLE, TENNESSEE AMENDING CITY CODE TITLE 10 (OFFENSES – MISCELLANEOUS), CHAPTER 1 (GENERALLY), SECTION 10-101 (CERTAIN MISDEMEANORS UNDER STATE LAW) TO ADOPT BY REFERENCE STATE TRAFFIC OFFENSES, RULES OF THE ROAD, AND CERTAIN OTHER MISDEMEANORS.

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to adopt by reference state traffic offenses, registration requirements, Rules of the Road, and certain other misdemeanors; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee General Assembly amended the laws pertaining to adoption of state laws by municipalities by reference, by changing the statute under which such adoption is made and by further specifying that Class C misdemeanors may be adopted by municipalities and enforced as municipal ordinance violations; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee General Assembly also provided that, in any municipality having a population in excess of one hundred fifty thousand (150,000), according to the 2000 federal census or any subsequent federal census, a municipal court also possesses jurisdiction to enforce any municipal law or ordinance that mirrors, substantially duplicates, or incorporates by cross-reference the language of certain criminal statutes relative to certain Class A and Class B misdemeanors; and

WHEREAS, the City of Clarksville, Tennessee, per the 2020 Federal Census, had a population of 166,722.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLARKSVILLE TENNESSEE:

The language of City Code Title 10, Section 10-101 is hereby repealed in its entirety, and new language is substituted as follows:

10101. Adoption of certain misdemeanors under state law. By reference granted under *Tennessee Code Annotated*, § 1618302, the City of Clarksville adopts by reference as if fully set forth in this section, the "Rules of the Road" and certain other misdemeanors under state law.

A CITY OF CLARKSVILLE RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES TO PERFORM A STUDY WITH REGARD TO CREATION OF A STEP PAY PLAN FOR THE FIRE DEPARTMENT AND POLICE DEPARTMENT EMPLOYEES AND TO ESTABLISH A DEDICATED PUBLIC SAFETY PAY STRUCTURE SEPARATE FROM THE GENERAL CITY PAY SCALE AND RETURN AN ORDINANCE FOR CONSIDERATION BY THE CITY COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, the City of Clarksville recognizes the unique demands, risks, and responsibilities of its firefighters and police officers, whose work is essential to the safety and well-being of the community; and

WHEREAS, the current general city pay structure does not adequately reflect the specialized nature of public safety roles or provide a clear path for advancement tied to service, training, and performance; and

WHEREAS, implementing a separate public safety pay structure—distinct from the general employee pay scale—will allow the City to more effectively recruit, retain, and reward qualified firefighters and police officers; and

WHEREAS, a structured step pay plan promotes transparency, career development, and long-term retention by providing predictable pay increases based on years of service and qualifications.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLARKSVILLE, TENNESSEE:

1. Plan Development: The City Council requests the Human Resources Department director and staff to conduct a study regarding the creation of a dedicated public safety pay umbrella for the Clarksville Fire Rescue Department and Clarksville Police Department and return their recommendations and an ordinance for consideration by the Finance and Administration committee and City Council prior to the December, 2025 executive session meeting (currently scheduled on December 25, 2025). This structure shall be independent of the general city employee pay plan and tailored to the specific demands of public safety work.

2. Fire Department Step Pay Plan: The City Council requests the Human Resources Department director and staff, in coordination with the Fire Chief, to conduct a study regarding the creation and development of a comprehensive step pay plan for the Clarksville Fire Rescue Department to include: (1) Defined pay grades and advancement steps; (2) Increases based on years of service, training, certifications, and performance; and (3) a mechanism for periodic review to ensure competitiveness and fiscal responsibility, and return their recommendations and an ordinance for

consideration by the Finance and Administration committee and City Council prior to the December, 2025 executive session meeting (currently scheduled on December 25, 2025).

3. Police Department Step Pay Plan: The City Council requests the Human Resources Department director and staff, in coordination with the Police Chief to conduct a study regarding the creation and development of a comprehensive step pay plan for the Clarksville Police Department to include: (1) Defined pay grades and advancement steps; (2) Increases based on years of service, training, certifications, and performance; and (3) a mechanism for periodic review to ensure competitiveness and fiscal responsibility, and return their recommendations and an ordinance for consideration by the Finance and Administration committee and City Council prior to the December, 2025 executive session meeting (currently scheduled on December 25, 2025).

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes the need for a pay adjustment for Clarksville Fire and Rescue in the fiscal year 2026-2027 to target recruitment and retention; and

WHEREAS, the City Council acknowledges the challenge to add more pay and benefits, and realizes that the City can work to implement small steps to adjusting wages for our first responders.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLARKSVILLE, TENNESSEE:

1. The City Council requests the City's Chief Financial Officer and Finance Department staff to conduct a study regarding the cost to increase pay in the fiscal year 2026-2027, within the Clarksville Fire and Rescue Department with the below considerations, and return their recommendations and an ordinance for consideration to the Finance and Administration Committee and City Council at the November 6, 2025 City Council Executive Session meeting.

a.) **Recruit:** In Academy (6 months), CFR pay increased to \$46,000.

b.) **Firefighter 2 (F2):** With EMR and Academy certifications, CFR pay increased to \$49,000.

(Estimated personnel impact and cost for **F2:** 150 x \$3,000 = \$450,000).

c.) **Firefighter 3 (F3):** With F2 plus Acting Officer (AO) plus Driver (PDO / AADO) certification, CFR pay increased to \$52,000. (Estimated personnel impact and cost **F3:** 50 x \$3,000 = \$150,000) .

d.) **Firefighter 4 (F4):** With F3 plus EMT certification, CFR pay increased to \$58,000.

(Estimated personnel impact and cost **F4:** 38 x \$6,000 = \$228,000)

e.) **Advanced Fire Officer:** With Bachelors in Fire Science or Management equivalent and FO4 an annual bonus of \$7,500. (Estimated personnel impact and cost **Advanced Administrator Fire Officer:** $45 \times \$7,500 = \$337,500$).

This structure shall be independent of the general city employee pay plan and tailored to the specific demands of public safety work.

WHEREAS, the current pay for a new recruit at the Clarksville Police Department is \$48,000; and

WHEREAS, the Clarksville Police Department (CPD) leadership has stated that there is a need to incentivize or increase pay for CPD personnel in order to recruit and retain personnel; and

WHEREAS, over the past four years (between July 2021 and July 2025), CPD has lost approximately 150 personnel, as indicated by the below graph, Exhibit “A”, many of those officers having had under four years of service on the force; and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes the challenges to add more pay and benefits, and the Council realizes that it can work to implement small steps to a complex situation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLARKSVILLE, TENNESSEE:

1. The City Council requests the City’s Chief Financial Officer and Finance Department staff to conduct a study regarding the cost to increase pay in the fiscal year 2026-2027, within the Clarksville Police Department with the below considerations, and return their recommendation and an ordinance for consideration to the Finance and Administration Committee and City Council at the November 6, 2025 City Council Executive Session meeting.

a.) Develop and implement a suitable pay that will target recruitment and initial retention. This increase will impact all personnel from the second through sixth year of service.
Example: An annual \$6,000 pay increase equates to a \$500 per month.

b.) Develop and implement a suitable pay that will target mid-career to senior level employees (seventh years of service and beyond).
Example: An annual \$7,200 pay increase equates to a \$600 per month.

c.) Outline how much of a tax increase would have to happen under one or both of the mentioned conditions.
